BOOK SUMMARY

······ MATTHEW

SETTING

This true story about Jesus' life was written by Matthew, one of His disciples (someone chosen to learn closely from Him). Matthew wrote this story within two decades of Jesus' death. Back then, that was considered a really short and trustworthy time frame! Some of the eyewitnesses to Jesus' life, death, and resurrection (rising from the dead) were still alive! That meant that they could confirm what Matthew was saying!

The way Matthew chooses his words tells us that the people he was writing to probably knew the story of the Old Testament. (He points back to it a lot of times!) That likely means that much of his audience was Jewish. Why is that important for us to know? Because God's story of saving people from sin (the ways we rebel against Him) didn't start when Jesus came!

God has been working out His plan and helping His people for a very long time! (See Who is God's Family? It will help you know some of what Matthew's readers knew!) If we're going to really see who Jesus is and what He came to do, we need the Old Testament!

Matthew's story happened in the Roman Empire, in the land of Israel, about 2000 years ago. That land was given to the Jewish people by God, but they lost control of it because they ignored God's instructions and love. He gave them many warnings and pleaded with them to stop, but eventually, the consequences came.

The Romans were now in power, and the Jewish people were waiting for a Rescuer from God. Almost no one was expecting the kind of Rescuer that God sent! He knew that His people's biggest enemy wasn't Rome or any human power, but Evil itself. That's the very thing that made them ignore His love and instructions! God was going to destroy darkness (that's another word for evil) and death by sending Jesus!



OVERVIEW

In Matthew, Jesus shows us with His actions and tells us with His words that He's the true King over everything! He's the Rescuer sent by God! He's actually God Himself!

Matthew records more of Jesus' teachings than almost anyone else! We also get to see Jesus do miracles, like healing people. He shows us what life is like with Him as the King.

In God's Kingdom (Matthew also calls it the Kingdom of Heaven), sad people will be comforted, sick people will be healed, poor people will have all they need, sins (the ways we rebel against God) will be forgiven, and people will be blessed for being gentle and peaceful.

Jesus' Kingdom is different than the Kingdoms of this world! At the end of the story, King Jesus shows His power in a very unusual way—by dying for His people. God raises Him from the dead, and Jesus has the victory!

Throughout the story, Matthew shows us how people react to Jesus. Some worship Him and believe that He's the King and Messiah (the Rescuer that God promised). Some don't believe Him and fight against Him. Sometimes the stories surprise us because the ones who love Jesus aren't the ones we expect. As we watch those scenes happen, it calls us to think about how we will respond to Him, too.

**One thing to note: Sometimes, "the Jews" appear in Matthew's stories. He's almost always talking about the Jewish leaders (including the Pharisees) who were against Jesus and eventually plotted to have Him killed. He doesn't usually mean the average person of the Jewish faith.



THEMES

For Matthew, one of the biggest themes is "fulfillment" (that means the coming of things you've been waiting for or the finishing of unfinished things). The whole story of the Bible has been moving toward Jesus' arrival. And now He's here!

Matthew points back to the Old Testament dozens of times (even just a few words at a time) to help his readers see how Jesus fulfills its promises and patterns. Matthew starts his book with a list of family members to see how Jesus fits in the big story.

Matthew takes a few key people from Israel's history, and in just a few words, shows how their lives pointed to Jesus. For example, he mentions the greatest Old Testament Israelite King—David. His life pointed to the true King—King Jesus! He does the same thing with Moses and Abraham (important people in the Old Testament story).

In Jesus, all the hints, promises, and threads from the very beginning come together. But

the fulfillment is bigger, better, and much different than what anyone had expected. Even Jesus' disciples didn't fully see what His life and death meant until after His resurrection (being raised from the dead). Sometimes we can only see things clearly after they've happened!

Remember to watch for the phrase "the Kingdom of God "or "the Kingdom of Heaven" as you go! Every King has a Kingdom, and Jesus brought about God's reign on Earth in a whole new way! The King had come in person, bringing His rule of perfect righteousness (that's God's goodness), justice, kindness, and power among us. He taught the people of His Kingdom how to live like He does and join His mission.

By dying for His people and rising from the dead, Jesus saved us from our sin, showed us what Kingdom love looks like, and fulfilled many of the promises God had made in the Old Testament.

HOW TO USE

In Matthew's gospel, we see that Jesus wants us to be a part of His family and citizens of His Kingdom! How will we respond? Will we believe what Jesus says about Himself, each of us, and His Kingdom? Will you let Him love and forgive you? Will you be one of His people?

People in the community gave them LOTS of respect for their religious education on the Bible. Note: People were amazed at Jesus' teaching because it had an authority the scribes' did not.



BACKSTORY

(vs. 1-3) Leprosy is a skin disease causing withered hands, scaly skin, sores, and ulcers. It smells similar to a dead, rotting animal, and sometimes the skin would fall off, including the nose. There

was no cure for leprosy, and it spread through touch, so people with leprosy had to announce they were coming by shouting, "Unclean, Unclean!" People were afraid of catching it, so they sent the lepers outside the city where they had no friends, no work, and no neighbors.








The followers of Jesus Christ are called disciples. He supports them by giving instructions on how to be a disciple and also how to handle rejection.

(vs. 1-2) Jerusalem was home to the Temple, a huge, GINORMOUS, building where God chose to put His presence. Jesus predicts this Temple will one day be entirely gone. He had told his disciples (12:6) that there is One greater than the Temple. It was Himself- Jesus! God was coming to be with the people in a new way!
